

What COVID-19 means for hiking and outings

The Long Trail and side trails in Sterling Section are currently closed to the general public. Trails on state land are closed every year for 'mud season' to help the trails dry out, particularly at elevation. This year, that closure is reinforced by a general closure of Long Trail facilities (privies, shelters, etc.) as part of Vermont's response to the COVID-19 pandemic.
